From the Manse



Have you ever wanted a make-over? Perhaps of your living room, your garden, your face or body? There are now many television shows transforming gardens and houses, and family shopping budgets and eating patterns, and we can even follow the weight loss journey of total strangers.

Have you ever wanted to makeover your life? Perhaps wishing you could do things differently the second time around, learning from the mistakes you had made first time, but couldn't reverse? Whilst we can't turn the clock back 20, or 30 or even 60 years, we can have a fresh start in our relationship with God. Our God is the God of new beginnings. He is the God of the hope found in the stable in Bethlehem, and the God of redemption - found in an empty tomb in Jerusalem. He offers us a new beginning in our walk with him.

Revelation 21:5 - "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."

The Bible is clear that Jesus will make everything new when he returns and makes a new heaven and a new earth. But he is already making things new for "we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ Jesus was raised from the dead by the glory of the father, so we too might walk in **newness of life**." *Romans* 6:4

Are you walking in newness of life with Jesus or going on the way it has always been?

We live in world that is enamoured with what is new: new films, new music, new books, new cars. God offers something bigger, something eternal, a new beginning with him. God gave Moses a new beginning and Paul got one too.

How do you want to reconnect anew with God this year?

How would your life be different if you walked more closely with God? God is ready to walk by your side.

What practical changes do you need to make to help you grow closer to him? Maybe it is obvious to you; maybe you need to spend time asking him in prayer. Do you need to read your Bible daily? Apps and books are available with daily reading plans. Should you set aside a regular time to pray? Or review the time and effort that you give to God? Or simply stop for a few moments each day and think of him? Recognise that all you do is done for him. Don't be afraid to walk more closely with him.

God loves new beginnings. Every spring we see new buds on the trees, and already new shoots are pushing through the earth, the first signs of the new flowers that will soon grace our gardens. Every morning there is a new sunrise as the sun climbs over the horizon - even if we can't see it for the cloud! You are an example of a new creation. "Therefore if anyone is in Christ the new creation has come; the old has gone, the new is here." 2 *Corinthians* 5:17

So thank God for making you a new creation. Our relationship with him is foundational for everything else going on in our lives. He is the source of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness faithfulness and self- control. (*Galatians* 5:22-23). When our relationship with him suffers, everything else suffers too.

Make today a turning point.

If you struggle to have a positive outlook, take strength from God's promises - the early Christians did, even in the face of persecution. Take your hope from God's word "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more, mourning and crying and pain will be no more" *Revelation* 21:4.

Lord God, thank you for new beginnings, for your mercies which are new every morning. Each day is full of new opportunities, help me to seize them with both hands. Thank you for making me a new creation in Jesus, help me to walk closer with you, and please guide me how best to do this. Amen.

I hope and I pray that each day will be a new opportunity for you, and that you will take advantage of it.

New Year is a time for new habits and we thought we would try to encourage you to adopt some new habits for the sake of our planet.



Feed the birds - seeds, nuts and fat balls go down well, or make an apple feeder. Core an apple, thread it through with a string and tie in a loop. Fill core space with mixture of lard/suet/seeds, set in fridge. Later stick 2 sticks into apple as perching points, then hang out in the garden.

Think about planting ahead of time - wildlife-friendly plants, food for pollinators, perhaps an area for wild flowers, and longer grasses.

Don't tidy up the piles of rotting leaves too early, insects will be hiding in them throughout the winter.

Fix a dripping tap quickly and consider a water butt in the garden to water the garden with in the summer.

We have been having a lot of fun at *Trash* over the past couple of months. When the young people arrive, they can play pool, table tennis, table football and other table top games as we start our night. After a while we will usually have an all-inclusive game or activity to get everyone together. After these games we will sit down for our bible study. It is great seeing the growth in these young people and their understanding of their faith deepening. Frequently, we will not get through all my planned questions as a question will take the discussion in a different direction and the young people ask more questions and the discussion continues.

Over the next few months we will be looking at the prophecies about Jesus as well as some of the Old Testament characters. We will also be trialling some materials produced by the Church of Scotland on stewardship.

In November the young people of *Trash* organised the *Tearfund Big Quiz*. We received a letter this week from head of *Tearfund Scotland* thanking us for the £275 raised by *Trash*. Thank you to everyone who supported this event and to the young people of *Trash* who organised and ran it.

This year a number of the young people of *Trash* will be sitting exams from the 24th April through to the 1st June. Please do pray for the young people as they start to prepare for the exams. If you would be willing to pray for an individual young person on the days of their exams, please let me know and I can provide you with their exam timetable.



Messy Church

With the easing of some of the restrictions we were able to hold an Advent themed *Messy Church* event at the end of November. We were not allowed to hold it like we did before, with people moving around the different activities and mixing together; everyone had to stay at a table and the activities were brought to them. We also couldn't serve a full meal,

but we were able to provide an afternoon tea of sandwiches and cakes. Despite the restrictions, it was great seeing families come together, do some activities together and have fun at church.

We are planning on holding these monthly at the moment and running them for a shorter time. The January one will take place on the 29th from 2pm to 3pm- without any food or drink being served. The February one will take place on Saturday the 26th.


